****CPHSLA to Tour September 22****



The Penn State Harrisburg's Heindel Library has a whole new look and is ready for the 21st century. As the century changed from 1999 to 2000, the materials of the previous 4 library locations were being moved to the new building. The library of the future opened its new state-of-the-art facility on January 5, 2000. According to CPHSLA member Eric Delozier's "New Library Highlights" in the Fall 1999 issue of *Capital College Libraries News*, some new features include public seating for 742, a total of 927 data ports, 13 video ports, a library instruction lab, a slide library, 2 seminar rooms, and a CyberCafe. The new library is 115,000 square feet and it has more than doubled previous shelf capacity to 480,000.

Penn State Harrisburg's new library is the location for the CPHSLA's fall 2000 meeting, which is to be held Friday September 22. In addition to touring this fantastic facility, the group will have a business meeting and course on PubMed.

CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by President Goodman at 10:13AM

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Reminder that, as of January 1, 2000 Geisinger Medical Center is no longer able to participate in the CPHSLA free reciprocal ILL arrangement; they “will provide service to libraries who participate in the Region 8/Region 1 EFTS system or IFM system within OCLC at the new cost of \$11.00 for document delivery, \$22.00 for telefacsimilie.”

Laurie Schwing, who had breast cancer surgery and is doing well, sent her thanks for the flowers CPHSLA sent.

Introductions were made around the table.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes from the December meeting were approved pending the addition of attendance. The secretary, Gayle Stauffer, requested that the attendance list from the December meeting be sent to her ASAP.

TREASURER’S REPORT:

The Treasurer’s Report is as printed in the newsletter with two further deductions of \$80.00 to Bucknell and \$50.00 for flowers. An updated report will be sent to the Secretary for inclusion with the minutes from the April meeting.

PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORT: Patrice Hall

The next meeting will probably be at Penn State, Middletown’s new library (see New Business). The committee is looking for suggestions for meeting topics. Docline training was mentioned but generally dismissed as “not needed” since the new format is quite intuitive. Another session of PubMed training was favorably received since NLM continues to revise and refine PubMed and trainers are available.

SPECIAL PROJECTS: Patrice Hall

Patrice reviewed her findings as detailed in the March newsletter. Using HSLC as a host site seems to be the least complicated and most economical way to go. Our organization, CPHSLA, will need to be a member of HSLC (the fee for which will be waived). Patrice believes she will be able to handle setting up a simple website on a host that supports FrontPage. Mike Heyd asked if it might be possible to host our site on a CPHSLA member site. Most members present doubted that their institutions would allow this; finding a willing site with a member willing to be webmaster could be complicated. The motion was made by Mike Heyd and seconded by Deb Lovett that the committee pursue hosting our website on HSLC. The motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Penn State Middletown will most likely be our next meeting site. Eric Delozier will be contacted and asked to secure September

8 as our meeting date. December 1 was generally agreed on as the preferred date for the winter meeting. A site is being sought with Altoona as one possibility. If a meeting is held at Altoona, they will be happy to demonstrate CyberTools, a web-based integrated library system designed for medical libraries. Other potential meeting topics were suggested; they included:

- (1) Copyright – Laura Goodman will check on a possible speaker.
- (2) The role of the librarian and the transition from text to online – how librarian’s roles are changing, how administrators see librarians and their roles and/or the need for librarians in the age of “full text online”

The Program Committee welcomes ALL suggestions.

MISCELLANEOUS:

A new membership/dues form is being designed. It will include questions other than the usual demographic “name, rank, and serial number” that will provide helpful information about our member institutions (for example, institutional web page addresses, databases used). If you have questions you would like to see include, contact the Membership Committee.

Cheryl Capitani will provide a free copy to each institution of the book [Show.me](#) which is a book of photos and comments by breast cancer survivors.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:02. After a short break we gathered for the program for the day, Peggy Trevanion’s presentation on “Usage Statistics.” This was followed by a tour of the Women’s Resource Center and lunch at the Pine Barn Inn.

FROM THE PA TURNPIKE (I-76): Get off at Exit 19. Follow PA 283 East toward Harrisburg International Airport. Follow signs for the airport and the college. Before entering the airport complex, take the exit for PA 230. Turn left at the junction of 230. Proceed on 230 East approximately one mile; the college entrance is on the left.

FROM LANCASTER AND POINTS EAST: Take Rt. 283 West toward Harrisburg International Airport. Follow signs for the airport and the college. Before entering the airport complex, take the exit for PA 230.
